Ouestion

- Work with your Clubber on their book
 - Verse Memorization
 - Red/Green Jewels (Sparks)
 - Silver/Gold Achievement
- Be willing to lend a hand during special events
- Help your Clubber remember to come prepared, especially on Theme Nights
- Wear sneakers or socks for game time
- Outfits too tight or too short, even though unintentional give a negative impression. We ask that there be no bare midriff for boys or girls and that shorts have at least a 5" inseam.
- Gum, food and drink are to be enjoyed before or after club.
- Treat church property respectfully.
- Treat others respectfully.



The 5 Count is used by all leaders and simply involves counting to 5 to allow Clubbers time to settle and quiet down in order to focus their attention.

1-2-3 Rule

The 1-2-3 Rule allows a Clubber three opportunities to understand that rules are important and must be followed in order for them and others to enjoy participating in club activities.

- 1. Clubbers will be advised by their club leader or the commander if they have violated a club rule.
- 2. If an offense occurs a second time the Clubber will be removed from club and sent to the Commander to discuss the issue and the parents will be notified.
- 3. If a third offense occurs the Clubber will remain with the Commander or Secretary until the end of club. The Clubber will not be allowed to come back to the Club unless they and their parents agree to follow Club rules in the future.





Clubbers are eligible to receive points for attending Sunday School or Church. Attendance at a church other than Penn Yan Bible Church is accepted. Up to two absences per period are allowed. To obtain credit for Sunday School/Church attendance, Clubbers are asked each week during check-in whether or not they have attended Sunday School or Church



Awards

The goal of awards is to encourage, motivate and reward the clubbers. Awards are earned throughout the year for completion of sections as they work through their book and for attendance. These awards are handed out monthly as earned.

*Final placement of each clubber in an appropriate classroom will be decided by the Commander, Leaders and the parents.

The Clubbers earn points by having all items at check in; bringing a friend, completing sections in their book and participating on theme nights. Those points translate to 'Awana Bucks' which allows the clubber to shop at the Awana store twice a year or for T & T and Youth Group they can apply those points to earning a scholarship to one of two summer camps.

Any parent that feels we have missed an award that your child should receive please see the secretary at the check in table.

arrival|departure

The Awana program begins at 6:00. Please be sure that your child is on time and prepared for club that night. Your child will begin the evening with the entire Awana program in the Sanctuary. They are then dismissed to go to their classroom. They then can be picked up in the Sanctuary at 8:00

A TYPICAL CLUB NIGHT

Arrival Time - Check in and opening ceremony

3YRS - 5YRS

The Cubbies program is built around God's Word with fun and purpose. Different lessons are learned each week through the use of puppets, music, games and flannel boards. Crafts relevant to the lesson are also made each week. The Cubbie's book includes a CD that helps them memorization.



Parent involvement is very important to the Cubbies program. Each week there is a Bear Hug to read to your little Cubbie and a verse for them to memorize. The Cubbie Handbook gives you specific instructions on how to help your Cubbie understand each lesson.

There is space for a parent's signature with each Bear Hug. Please remember to sign it after completing the lesson so that your Cubbies' Leader knows the section has been worked on.



KINDERGARTEN TO 2ND GRADE

Sparks dig a little deeper into God's Word. Clubbers

learn basic truths about God, Jesus Christ, salvation and the Bible as they work through each book. The Sparks program has three separate books: Hang Glider, Wing Runner and Sky Stormer. Each book comes with a CD to help the Clubbers and parents in the memorization of God's Word. As always parental involvement is key to helping your child hide God's Word in their heart!





3RD-6THGRODE

The T & T (Truth & Training) curriculum teaches kids the truth of God's Word, how to follow Him and practice His grace through a fun and engaging Bible Study and scripture memorization.

Scholarships and Camps

Throughout the year as your student works hard to earn points toward a scholarship, you can help them by encouraging completion of their weekly lesson, memorizing verses, coming prepared, doing theme nights and being part of class participation.

By doing this your student will earn points toward a scholarship for a week at either Letourneau Christian Camp or Word of Life Camp in Schroon Lake.

Points for the different levels of the scholarship are:

Yellow: 250-599 points(1/4 scholarship)

Red: 600-1099 points (1/2 scholarship)

Blue: 1100-1599 points (3/4 scholarship)

Green: 1600-or more points (Full scholarship)

If a student puts forth reasonable effort they will easily earn enough for a full scholarship

Points reset at the end of each year.
